

What do Automotive Technicians and Repairers do?

Automotive technicians and repairers inspect, maintain, and repair
electric, gas, hybrid, and alternative fuel vehicles. In smaller businesses,
their duties may include a full range of repair and maintenance services.
In larger businesses, they may specialize in certain areas, such as brakes,
transmissions, or air conditioning systems. Auto techs work on traditional
mechanical components; however, they must also be familiar with a growing number
of electronic systems controlled primarily by computers and electronic components.
Other integrated electronic systems, such as accident-avoidance sensors, are becoming
common as well.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have plenty of opportunities for employment as an automotive technician or repairer once you've completed a certificate or associate degree. Programs usually last six months to a year and provide intensive career preparation through classroom instruction and hands-on practice.

As an Automotive Technician or Repairer you will:

- Explain to clients their automotive problems and the repairs done on their vehicles
- Follow checklists to ensure that all critical parts are examined
- Identify mechanical problems, often by using computerized diagnostic equipment
