What do Truck Drivers and **Driver/Sales Workers do?**

Truck drivers and driver/sales workers pick up, transport, and drop off packages and small shipments within a local region or urban area. They drive a truck or other vehicle over established routes or within an established territory and sell or deliver goods, such as food products, including restaurant take-out items, or pick up or deliver items, such as commercial laundry. They may also take orders, collect payment, or stock merchandise at the point of delivery. This includes newspaper delivery drivers. Most of the time, delivery truck drivers transport merchandise from a distribution center to businesses and households. Delivery truck drivers and driver/sales workers have a physically demanding job, driving for long periods, loading and unloading cargo, and doing a lot of lifting, carrying, and walking.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have plenty of employment opportunities as a delivery truck driver and driver-sales once you earn a certificate. You must have a valid driver's license and possess a clean driving record. Companies train new delivery truck drivers and driver/sales workers on the job.

As a Customer Service Representative you will:

- > Accept payments for the shipment
- Follow all applicable traffic laws
- Load and unload their cargo
- Handle paperwork, such as receipts or delivery confirmation notices
- Maintain their truck and associated equipment to be clean and in good working order
- Recommend new products or services to clients and solicit new customers
- Report on the road incidents and serious mechanical problems to a dispatcher
