What do Nursing Assistants do?

Wherever there is a need for personal care, nursing assistants are there. Nursing assistants help patients of all ages perform the most basic daily tasks. They work under a nurse's supervision. Nursing assistants have extensive daily contact with each patient, and therefore play a key role in their lives. They keep the nurse up to date on vital information about the patients' conditions. Some nursing assistants also may dispense medication, depending on their training level and the state in which they work. In nursing homes and residential care facilities, nursing assistants are often the principal caregivers. They have more contact with residents than other members of the staff.

Nursing Assistants are in demand in Livingston County!

Livingston County employment of nursing assistants is expected to increase through 2020. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics recognizes the job outlook for nursing assistants as growing much faster than average.

Training & Educational Opportunities

Nursing assistants must complete a state-approved education program in which they learn the basic principles of nursing and complete supervised clinical work to earn a certificate. Nursing assistants may be required to pass a background check.

As a Nursing Assistant you will:

- Clean and bathe patients or residents
- Help patients use the toilet and dress
- Listen to and record patients' health concerns and report that information to nurses
- Measure patients' vital signs, such as blood pressure and temperature
- Serve meals and help patients eat
- Turn, reposition, and transfer patients between beds and wheelchairs
