demand in Livingston County! Registered Nurses (RNs) use a large base of knowledge to assess, plan and intervene to promote health, prevent disease and help patients cope with illness. RNs are employed in a wide variety of professional settings, often specializing in their field of practice. When providing direct patient care, nurses observe, assess and record symptoms, reactions and progress which provides the basis for care planning and intervention. They are health educators and advocates for patients, families and communities.

Registered nurses' duties and titles often depend on where they work and the patients they work with. For example, an oncology nurse may work with cancer patients or a geriatric nurse may work with elderly patients. Some RNs combine one or more areas of practice.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have plenty of employment options as a registered nurse, but first you will need to earn at least an associate degree. An associate degree in nursing (ADN) includes courses in anatomy, nutrition, chemistry and microbiology among others. Many nurses also earn a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing (BSN). State licensure as a Registered Nurse is through the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation.

As a Registered Nurse you will:

- Administer medications
- > Care for the needs of your patients
- > Communicate as part of a team
- Conduct research in support of improved patient outcomes

Livingston County employment of registered nurses is expected to increase

through 2020. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics recognizes registered nursing as among the top 10 U.S. occupations with the largest job growth.

Registered Nurses are in

- > Direct and supervise care delivered by other healthcare personnel
- Maintain patient charts and file paperwork
- Perform physical exams and health histories
- Provide health counseling and education
