What do Supervisors of Production and Operating Workers do?

This position involves the direct supervision of workers in a variety of work environments. The common thread are general job tasks which involve scheduling work, safety, performance reviews, operational work assignments, and training. Production and operating supervisors oversee and coordinate the activities of inspectors, precision workers, machine setters and operators, assemblers, mechanics, installers, repairers, fabricators, and plant and system operators.

Production and Operating Supervisors are in demand in Livingston County!

Livingston County employment of supervisors of production and operating workers is expected to increase through 2020.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have plenty of employment opportunities as a supervisor of production and operating workers, with a combination of experience and training. By completing courses and earning a degree in manufacturing technology, conflict resolution, leadership, and word processing you will learn the skills necessary for employment as a supervisor of production and operating workers.

As a Supervisor of Production and Operating Workers you will:

- Determine schedules, sequences, and assignments for work activities, based on work priority, quantity of equipment, and skill of personnel
- Inspect and monitor work areas
- Investigate accidents or injuries and prepare reports of findings
- Monitor employees' work levels and review work performance
- Provide employee safety training to prevent, detect, and correct unsafe conditions or violations
- Requisition materials and supplies, such as tools, equipment, or replacement parts
