What do Industrial Truck and Tractor Operators do?

Industrial truck and tractor operators operate industrial trucks or tractors equipped to move materials around a warehouse, storage yard, factory, construction site, or similar location. They generally receive short-term on-the-job training prior to performing their job at an acceptable level. It is an occupation that is needed for a variety of different industries. As an operator, you will be working with a lot of different tools and equipment. Feeling comfortable with each one and understanding how to use them safely is an important part of the job. Most material moving machine operators work full time, and overtime for them is common. Because materials are shipped around the clock, some operators, especially those in warehousing, work overnight shifts.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have many employment opportunities as an industrial truck and tractor operator once you've completed the required certification. Heavy and tractor-trailer truck drivers usually have a high school diploma and attend professional truck driving school and/or complete on-the-job training. You can also obtain a commercial driver's license (CDL).

As an Industrial Truck or Tractor Operator you will:

- Inspect product load for accuracy and safely move it around the warehouse or facility
- Manually or mechanically load or unload materials from pallets, skids, platforms, cars, lifting devices, or other transport vehicles
- Move levers or controls that operate lifting devices such as forklifts, lift beams with swivel-hooks, or elevating platforms, to load, unload, transport or stack material
